Construction of the E-763 Highway,

Mountain Jelica conquered

In the presence of the Prime Minister of the Republic of Serbia Miloš Vučević, representatives of the Government of the Republic of Serbia, the mayors of Čačak, Lučani and Požega, Milun Todorović, Milivoje Dolović and Đorđe Nikitović and the director of the PE "Roads of Serbia" Zoran Drobnyak and his associates, on 17.10.2024. the right tube of the Munjino Brdo tunnel was bored.

The Munjino Brdo tunnel was designed with two tunnel tubes, one tube for each direction, in which one-way traffic takes place

Prime Minister Miloš Vučević congratulated our builders and Chinese partners and emphasized: "When completed, this tunnel will be the longest tunnel in Serbia, over two kilometers and 700 meters. I expect that on St. Vitus Day 2025, the entire section of the Pakovraće - Požega highway will be completed."



on two lanes. The width of the roadway in the tunnel is 7.70m, the height of the traffic profile is 4.75m. On both sides of the roadway are official pedestrian walkways, 1.19 m to 1.24 m wide, raised above the roadway by 7 cm, under which electrical and telecommunications installations are located. The length of the left tunnel tube is 2,755.75 m, the length of the right one 2,740.14 m.

Transverse pedestrian passages have also been designed for pedestrians to



cross from one tunnel tube to the other in the event of an emergency, which can also be used by emergency vehicles. Each tunnel tube has two emergency niches, extensions for removing broken down vehicles.

Transverse vehicle passages have also been designed for vehicles to cross from one tube to the other, whose dimensions allow buses and long trucks to cross from one side to the other in the event of an emergency situation. In the middle part of this transverse corridor there is space for a power substation.



Tunnel works are carried out in complex geological conditions, using a construction technology called the "New Austrian Method" (NATM), which involves mapping the tunnel excavation and measuring deformations according to the principle of 3 examples.

Practice is the most important

At the initiative and invitation of Acting Director Zoran Drobnjak, on October 10, 2024, a professional visit by professors and students of the Faculty of Civil Engineering, University of Belgrade was realized - presentation of the project and tour of the construction works on the E-763 Highway, Preljina-Požega section.

Acting Director Zoran Drobnjak, with his associates, contractors and supervision, presented to professors and students the working method, types and technology of construction of the route, road structures and tunnels, especially emphasizing the very difficult geographical terrain, which is why numerous tunnels and bridges are being built, since almost one third of the route consists of bridges and tunnels.



After the presentation of the project, professors and students had a unique opportunity to tour the entire section being built in full profile of the highway with as-

sociated facilities, loops, tunnels and bridges, as well as to ask questions and receive expert answers.

Acting Director Zoran Drobnjak was with the professors and students the whole time and selflessly shared his many years of experience in construction, answering questions and at the same time advising young colleagues to spend more time in the field, because, as he emphasized, it is necessary for a good engineer to gain practice, precisely on a construction site.

"Without experience on a construction site, there is no good civil engineer!", Drobnjak pointed out.

Students and professors agreed that the strongest impression they carry from the field is the expertise of their colleagues who welcomed them in the role of hosts and their dedication to the project, led by Acting Director Zoran Drobnjak.



Every weekend at the construction site!

Acting Director Zoran Drobnjak, regardless of the weather and despite his numerous obligations, visits the construction works on the E-763 highway, Pakovraće-Požega section, every weekend with his associates.

During his last visit to the construction site, Director Drobnjak expressed his satisfaction with the dynamics of the works, emphasizing that all activities are taking place in accordance with the planned deadlines: "We are here every week, monitoring each segment of the works and doing everything to complete the highway on time. Our priority is to complete this section of the highway as soon as possible, but with the highest level of quality and safety. I would like to thank all the workers on the construction site for their dedication," said Drobnjak.

New Films about Roads of Serbia projects

Films about completed projects have been produced since 2019, as a testimony for all future generations about the great undertakings implemented by the PE "Roads of Serbia". A total of 23 films have been produced so far. Department for Public Relations continues to closely monitor the progress of infrastructure projects, in an effective manner, with detailed information and technical working data, expert reports in English and Serbian language presenting the work of PE "Roads of Serbia".

Bridge over the Kolubara River near Obrenovac Reconstructed

The works on the bridge over the Kolubara River in Obrenovac, on the state road of I B category N° 26, were completed on December 12, 2024. The works included two phases in which anti-corrosion protection of the steel structure of the bridge was carried out, pedestrian paths and elastic bumpers were repaired, the pedestrian path was reconstructed, waterproofed layers built, hard cast asphalt layer placed, new drains and new expansion joints were installed, as well as other works completed. The investor of the works was PE "Roads of Serbia" and the contractor "Strabag" Ltd.



Construction of the Iverak-Lajkovac expressway, subsection from Iverak to the Divci interchange completed

In the presence of the Prime Minister of the Republic of Serbia Miloš Vučević, Minister of Public Investments Darko Glišić, Ambassador of the People's Republic of China to Serbia Li Ming, members of the government, acting directors of the Roads of Serbia and the Corridors of Serbia, Zoran Drobnjak and Aleksandar Antić, representatives of contractors and subcontractors, as well as local governments, on February 1st, 2025, the construction of the Iverak - Lajkovac expressway, subsection Iverak - Divci interchange was completed.

The Iverak-Lajkovac expressway is very important for the entire Kolubara District as it connects the city of Valjevo with the Miloš Veliki highway, or the Belgrade



- South Adriatic highway. This highway shortens the journey to Belgrade and is a cross-connection in the road network of

the Republic of Serbia. It connects parts of the Republic of Srpska and Bosnia and Herzegovina with the E-763 highway and further via Corridor 10, with Bulgaria and Greece.



Subsection from Iverak to Divci interchange - 5.8 km

- 8 structures – bridges were built

From Šabac to Loznica in half an hour

The 54.5km expressway Šabac – Loznica was opened to traffic on December 30th, 2024 at 09:00. The road has 13 bridges and 16 overpasses, 17 culvert bridges and four graded intersections - in Majur, Slepčević, Petlovača and Prnjavor. The bridge in the settlement of Štitar, at the eighth kilometer of the expressway, 584m long, is the longest bridge on the section.

This road is part of the Ruma – Šabac – Loznica highway, one of the priority infrastructure projects that significantly contributes to the development and connection of Srem, Mačva, western Serbia and Vojvodina with the region and neighboring Bosnia and Herzegovina. With the opening of this section, the journey from Šabac to Loznica will take half an hour instead of an hour.

Bypass around Gornji Milanovac completed

In the presence of the President of Serbia Aleksandar Vučić, Ambassador of the People's Republic of China Li Ming, representative of the Government of the Republic of Serbia, President of "PowerChina Euroasia" Liu Sauchien, Acting Director of PE "Roads of Serbia" Zoran Drobnyak, Acting Director of "Corridors of Serbia" Aleksandar Antić, President of the Municipality of Gornji Milanovac Dejan Kovačević, contractors and a large number of citizens, on October 4th, 2024, the Bypass around Gornji Milanovac was opened to traffic.

The Bypass around Gornji Milanovac is part of the access road to the "Miloš Veliki" highway via the Takovo interchange, 9.4km long. It is divided into two subsections, each is 4.7km long. The first, from "Tenk" to Klatičevo, included the construction of a completely new road, with earthworks, cuts, slopes and embankments, while the second subsection, from Klatičevo to Takovo, included the reconstruction of the existing state road with the construction of four new bridges and one overpass.

Serbian President Aleksandar Vučić stated that he was happy that the Takovo region had received a modern road like those in Austria or Switzerland, which will contribute to the economic connection of the local economy with other regions, displace freight traffic from the city, make life easier in the city and its surroundings, and he thanked the contractor and the domestic companies that participated in the construction of the bypass.

Chinese Ambassador Li Ming pointed out that Serbia is progressing economically because it greatly values the construction of transport infrastructure, which is the path to prosperity of the country and added that this project is another connection between the two countries.

With the completion of this road, transit traffic in the municipality of Gornji Milanovac has been completely separated from local traffic, a comfortable traffic con-



nection has been obtained in the center of Gornji Milanovac, air pollution has been reduced and traffic safety has been increased.



Požarevac closer to the highway

On Saturday, February 22, 2025, in the presence of the President of Serbia, Aleksandar Vučić, the opening of 32km long repressway route, Požarevac - Veliko Gradište - Golubac, from E-75 Highway to Požarevac, and from Veliko Gradište to the entrance to Golubac, was officially marked.

With the President of the Republic, the opening ceremony was attend-

ed also by the directors of the company "Corridors of Serbia" and the PE "Roads of Serbia" Aleksandar Antić and Zoran Drobnyak, Minister of the Public Investments Darko Glišić and the Ambassador of the People's Republic of China to Serbia, Li Ming.

Two sections of the expressway were officially opened to traffic on Sunday, February 23, 2025 at 11 a m.

Morava Corridor Connects Kruševac and Vrnjačka Banja

Another section of the Morava Corridor was opened to traffic on December 23rd, 2024, at 9.30 am. The section of the E-761 motorway, Pojate - Preljina, from Kruševac (Koševi) to Vrnjačka Banja, has 3 subsections.

There are also 4 graded intersections on this section: "Koševi", "Velika Drenova", "Trstenik" and "Vrnjačka Banja", which are in operation, while entering and exiting the highway in the "Koševi" intersection zone is not possible yet.





Ready for The Winter Service 2024/2025

The Press Conference and Presentation of the Winter Service Plan 2024/25, which was held in „IN Hotel“ in Belgrade on November 1st, 2024, marked the beginning of the winter road maintenance. The Plan for winter maintenance of State roads of I and II category includes the organization of people, resources and machinery, the system of informing media, the public and all interested parties about the condition of state roads during the winter.

The Winter Service Plan was presented to the media by Dragan Pavković, the Head of Department for Highways in the Sector for Maintenance of I and II category State Roads, Ljerka Ibrović, Head of the Department for Public Relations and Marko Maslaković representing the Information Center of the PE "Roads of Serbia", togeth-



er with the Head of the Department for Inspection of State Roads in the Ministry of Construction, Transport and Infrastructure, Saša Draganović, Head of the Traffic Police Directorate in the Ministry of Interior of the Republic of Serbia Slaviša Lakićević, Assistant Head of the Fire and Rescue Units Directorate of the Emergency Situations Sector Miloš Milenković, Acting Director of the Traffic Safety Agency Branko Stamatović, Acting Assistant Director - Sector for Meteorological Observation System of the Republic Hydrometeorological Service Goran Mihajlović and Secretary General of AMSS Milan Nikolić, as well as representatives of road companies that carry out winter maintenance.

Roads of Serbia at 46th International Tourism Fair in Belgrade

This year, the PE "Roads of Serbia" was presented at the International Tourism Fair, which was held under the slogan "One Ticket, Countless Worlds" from February 20 - 23, 2025, under the domes of the Belgrade Fair.

Assistant Executive Director of Toll Collection Darko Savić highlighted all the advantages of electronic toll collection, with a special emphasis on the Toll4All web platform that allows users to pay tolls via a registered bank card. He also spoke about plans to modernize toll collection and invited all visitors to the Fair to take advantage of the opportunity and purchase a TAG device that would speed up and facilitate their traveling in Serbia as well as abroad.

He reminded that there are over 900,000 active users of electronic toll collection in Serbia. "Almost 50 percent of all vehicles that pass through toll stations no longer stop to pay the toll with cash, but rather do so via electronic toll collection – via tags, and around 60 percent of the revenue generated goes through electronic toll collection," said Savić.

The interest of the visitors was great.

At the Faculty of Transport and Communications in Belgrade, on October 31, 2024, a work meeting was held to analyze the implementation of the Action Plan for the period 2023-2025, within the framework of the Serbian Transport Safety Strategy for the period 2023-2030. The goals set by 2030 include the ambition for Serbia to be among the ten safest countries in Europe and for not a single child to lose their life in traffic accidents. Representatives of the PE "Roads of Serbia", Ivana Subotić and Marija Dotto, presented the performance of state road managers in the field of traffic safety and the activities set out in the Action Plan for the period 2023-2025.



Conference "TESi" 2024

Improving the Traffic safety system 2024

Ivana Subotić and Jovan Drobñjak represented our company at the expert meeting "Improving the traffic safety system 2024", which took place on October 17 – 19, 2024, in Zlatibor. The theme of the meeting was "Financing Traffic Safety in Local Governments - New Law on Road Traffic Safety". The aim of the project is to increase the working capacity of local councils with the support of competent institutions in the field of traffic safety on the territory of the Republic of Serbia.



Expert visit of the Transport Administration of the Government of Montenegro

On November 7th, 2024, an expert visit was carried out by representatives of the Transport Administration of the Government of the Republic of Montenegro - the state road manager to the Sector for TMIS - Department of Databases and Geoinformation Systems, with the aim of better informing themselves with the work processes and exchanging experience with colleagues from Serbia in the field of database development and improvement. Colleagues from Montenegro were presented with activities on the establishment and development of databases and application software. The guests were presented with a database on roads, traffic counting, databases on ob-



jects (bridges, tunnels, etc.), databases on railway crossings, traffic accidents. The meeting also addressed the challenges of updating data, the organization of its collection in the field, and all other available data

sources. Representatives of the Transport Authority of Montenegro were also shown a vehicle with "Dynatest" equipment, which the PE "Roads of Serbia" uses to record road conditions (road surface, etc.).

Training in work zones - implemented project

PE "Roads of Serbia" has implemented the project "Training in Work Zones", the main goal of which is to reduce the number of people killed and seriously injured during work on the state road network in the Republic of Serbia, through the following:

- Improvement of traffic signals and equipment used in road work zones;
- Better education of participants in the process of developing traffic signal and equipment projects during road work;
- Mitigation of the consequences of road traffic accidents and



- Reduction of the number of traffic accidents in road work zones.

In addition to the main objectives, the following tasks were also identified:

- Analysis of the current state of traffic safety in road work zones with a special focus on the analysis of the causes and consequences of traffic accidents in road work zones;
- Review of best international practices and standards for road work;
- Preparation of proposals for amendments to by-laws in the field of traffic regulation during road work;
- Providing proposals for innovating instructions (guidelines) for the design of traffic signals and equipment during road works;
- Preparing proposals for conducting training for designers, technical control, supervisory bodies, and experts at road works contractors;
- Conducting training for participants in the process of developing and implementing changes to traffic regimes during road works.

The training, conducted in accordance with the applicable regulations of the Republic of Serbia, was held in 3 sessions for 120 participants - representatives of ministries, contractors, supervisory authorities, traffic and traffic signaling designers (technical control).



Successful supervisory audit of the Energy management system SRPS ISO 50001:2018

On December 23, 2024, a supervisory audit was conducted according to the Energy Management System standard SRPS ISO 50001:2018. This is the first supervisory audit since the introduction of this standard in the company in 2023.

The supervisory audit was conducted by the certification company SGS. The Energy Management Department is responsible for the implementation of this standard within the PE "Roads of Serbia",

with the support of the Department for Integrated Management Systems and the SBOSS.

The method of data collection, software systems and databases, mechanisms for analyzing energy consumption and use, methodologies for forming energy performance indicators (EnPI – Energy Performance Indicator) for different consumer groups, as well as methodologies for determining energy baselines (EnB – Energy

Baseline) and criteria for determining significant energy consumption (SEU – Significant Energy Uses) were presented.

The presentation covered the system part of the standard, as well as an extensive data set and analysis of the technical part of the standard. The audit conclusions proved that the energy management system in the PE "Roads of Serbia" is well established and that critical components are covered.

Software for managing road inventory and the maintenance process of state roads of I and II category

The presentation of the software for managing road inventory and the maintenance process of state roads of the I and II category, developed in cooperation with the company "VIA Engineering" from Novi Sad, was held in the Great Hall of the PE "Roads of Serbia" on September 11, 2024.

The director of the company "VIA Engineering", Ljudevit Boričić, presented the company and the application developed in a web environment, using modern software technologies with visual displays of all entities and surfaces on the basis of ortho-photo images of the road belt.

Dragan Pavković, head of the Department of Highways, introduced his colleagues to all the benefits of this complex



software solution, which enables keeping records of all road phenomena and accompanying data for efficient and high-quality

decision-making through planning and monitoring of road network process of the maintenance and management.

Project for directing freight vehicles in transit



In the Great Hall of the PE "Roads of Serbia", on November 6, 2024, a meeting was held between representatives of the Ministry of Construction, Transport and Infrastructure, the PE "Roads of Serbia" and the Business Association "International Transport".

PE "Roads of Serbia", Sector for Strategy, Design and Development - Department

for Traffic Safety, in cooperation with the Ministry of Construction, Transport and Infrastructure, has initiated the development of Phase II of the directing of freight vehicles in transit on state roads in the Republic of Serbia.

The result of the initiative is the preliminary version of the "Traffic and Traffic Signaling Project for the Guidance of

Freight Vehicles in Transit on State Roads of IA Category in Order to Protect the Network of Lower-Class State Roads", which was prepared in accordance with the Regulation on the Determination of State Roads on Which Freight Vehicles in Transit through the Republic of Serbia Must Be Carried - Transit Corridor.

On this occasion, a meeting was held with representatives of the Business Association "International Transport", where the formed traffic signaling solutions were presented that will enable traffic regulation, in a way that ensures the retention of freight vehicles that are transiting through the territory of the Republic of Serbia on state roads of IA category, or that from border crossings, where freight traffic takes place, freight vehicles in transit through the Republic of Serbia move, if possible, by the shortest route via state roads of IB category and towards state roads of IA category.

Companies "PTC SOLUTIONING" and "AY YILDIZ"

The professional presentation of the companies "PTC Solutioning" and "Ay Yildiz", which are engaged in the production of equipment and steel structures for tunnels that can be used in quarries, mining, construction and other branches of the economy, was held in the Great Hall of the PE "Roads of Serbia", on October 15, 2024.

The representative of the two companies, Alen Evlić, presented a wide range of tools for all phases of tunneling and slope protection and presented the types of products in their production program.



Cooperation with international institutions

The Public Relations Department continues to foster long-standing cooperation with the European Association of Operators of Toll Road Infrastructure (ASECAP) and the International Road Federation (IRF) with the aim of presenting and improving the visibility of projects implemented by the PE "Roads

PE Roads of Serbia Launches New Educational Campaigns
August 20, 2024

Public Enterprise "Roads of Serbia" has officially launched two new educational campaigns aimed at improving traffic safety on national roads. The campaigns, titled "Safely through the tunnel" and "We are not alone in the tunnel", focus on educating drivers and all road users about safe behaviour in tunnels during both regular traffic conditions and emergency situations.

The campaign slogans accurately, graphically and clearly represent essential information for all traffic participants that PE "Roads of Serbia" implements as a socially responsible company, which manages the state road network in the Republic of Serbia.

"Safely through the tunnel"

The "Safely through the Tunnel" campaign aims to educate drivers on safe behaviour in tunnels under normal traffic conditions. The following actions should be taken before entering and while driving in a tunnel:

Before Entering and While Driving in the Tunnel:

- Obey the speed limit.
- Maintain a safe distance.
- Use low beams.
- Remove sunglasses.
- Close windows and turn on air circulation in the vehicle.
- Check fuel levels and engine temperature.
- Extinguish any cigarettes.
- Do not stop in the tunnel, except in emergencies and only in designated stopping areas.
- U-turns are prohibited.
- Reversing is not allowed.
- Turn off the engine if the vehicle is stopped for more than one minute.

"We are not alone in the tunnel"

The "We are not Alone in the Tunnel" campaign is designed to educate drivers on safe behaviour in tunnels during emergency situations that may endanger the lives of road users.

In the event of vehicle breakdown

- Turn on hazard lights.
- Safely stop the vehicle in a designated stopping area, or as close to the right edge of the road as possible.
- Turn off the engine and leave the key in the ignition.
- Put on a reflective vest and exit the vehicle on the right side.
- Place a warning triangle behind the stopped vehicle in the prescribed manner.
- Call for help from the SOS niche.
- Wait for the arrival of the emergency services.

In the event of fire

- If a fire starts in your vehicle and you can, drive it out of the tunnel to a safe location. If not, stop the vehicle in a way that does not endanger the safety of other road users.
- Turn on hazard lights.
- Turn off the engine and leave the key in the ignition.
- Put on a reflective vest and exit the vehicle.
- Help others in your vehicle to leave the scene of the fire as quickly as possible.
- Extinguish the fire in its early stages using a fire extinguisher from the vehicle or the apparatus located in the SOS niche, while ensuring your own safety.
- Activate the nearest manual fire alarm.
- If you cannot extinguish the fire, move to a safe distance and follow the instructions broadcast over the tunnel's loudspeaker.
- Start evacuating the tunnel by following the evacuation route signs to the nearest exit.
- Be mindful of passing emergency vehicles.
- Follow the instructions of the fire and rescue units during firefighting operations.

These campaigns are carried out by Public Enterprise "Roads of Serbia", with the support of the Ministry of Construction, Transport and Infrastructure, and the Ministry of Interior. PE "Roads of Serbia" has prepared educational videos, posters, social media announcements, and informational flyers in both Serbian and English. Guided by the belief that road accidents can be prevented, PE "Roads of Serbia" will continue to work systematically to raise awareness among all road users.



World Day of Remembrance for Road Traffic Victims Marked

PE "Roads of Serbia" marked the World Day of Remembrance for Road Traffic Victims in 2024 under the traditional slogan "Remember. Support. Do".

The day dedicated to the memory of the millions of road traffic victims has been marked at the proposal of the European Federation of Road Traffic Victims (FEVR) every third Sunday of November since 1995, and at the recommendation of the United Nations since 2005, in a large number of countries around the world.

The goals of marking the World Day of Remembrance for Road Traffic Victims in 2024 are to remember the victims and provide a social and legal platform for supporting victims and people injured in traffic and their families, while recognizing the work of emergency services and promoting all actions that prevent any further possibility of deaths and injuries in traffic.
